The Final Resting Place for Cremated Remains

This decision requires a lot of thought as the **final** resting place of the deceased is being determined.

For many people, this is an easy decision to make, there may be a family grave somewhere, a cremated remains plot or simply that the cremated remains are to be scattered in a favourite place particular to the deceased and their family.

In the event of the deceased not stating their wishes upon their death or the family not knowing what to do, here are a few options available to you:

Interment of the cremated remains in an existing family grave in a cemetery / churchyard.

Interment of the cremated remains in a new cremated remains grave in a cemetery / churchyard / green burial site.

Scatter the cremated remains at the crematorium

Scatter the cremated remains in a special place

Retain the cremated remains at home indefinitely

Another option of which many people may not be aware is to inter the cremated remains at Herongate Wood Green Cemetery. (You may visit the website on www.green-burial.co.uk). Plots are available that can hold up to four sets of cremated remains that enable loved ones to rest together forever. There is a choice of locations with the plots, some are situated next to the bluebell wood and others are adjacent to the pond.

It is important to note, that if the cremated remains are to go in an existing grave, this must be done in the correct manner through the proper authorities. It is illegal to actually scatter the remains over a grave without the permission of the cemetery / churchyard authority.

If the remains are to be scattered in a special place, for example on a favourite beach, park etc and then the landowner's permission must be sought beforehand.
